

You have 12 days to make your own personal pages in the yearbook. I have talked to some people about their personal pages and have learned that they may not be getting done because there is some confusion about what to do. I bought a yearbook and then logged on to see what the process looked like. I hope that what I have to say here will be helpful to you.

When you log on you are presented with the option to create your own two personal pages.

Here are some hints to make the process easier:

1. Go through your photo library and select all the pictures you would like to have on your two personal pages. Get them into a folder on the desktop of your computer.
2. When you look at the pages there are large and small boxes, you can make any box any size you want it. Click on the box and you will see an X and another sign pop up on the upper left corner. If you hit the X the box is gone. If you hit the other thing a duplicate of the box is made. You can do the same thing with the text boxes. There is a text for favorite teacher and favorite subject. You do not have to keep them and if you choose to keep the box but want different words in it then click on it and change the wording.
3. To make a box bigger, click on the box and you will see dots on the corners and sides. A corner dot with change box size proportionally. Side dot will shrink a box.

Here is what I did. I wanted to make a quilt work of pictures. I got the boxes the size I wanted them and then copied like crazy. I knew I had 66 pictures in my desktop folder. I changed the text message in two of the text boxes and now I was ready to get going.

1. At the bottom of the screen is a button that says add pictures. When you click on it you will be asked where you want to get the pictures from. You want them from your computer. Since you have the pictures in a folder on your desktop, select the folder. You can move all of them from the folder to the yearbook program by using click/shift. Click on the first picture then hold down the shift key and move to the last picture and click again. All the pictures will be highlighted.
2. You are given a privacy option, I chose to make the pictures only visible to me. I down loaded all my pictures. They ended up at the bottom of the page.
3. To move a picture onto the page click the picture. Move it to the box you want the picture in. Be sure the arrow is in the box. When you take your finger off the mouse button the picture will be moved to that box.
4. You can move the boxes any where you want them. You can tilt them, move to a corner, move out from the corner and you will see a swing arrow.

Please, please, please feel free to contact me with any questions, we are all new to this process, I have been learning along with everyone. Play around before you finalize your page, try some things. One nice thing is you do not have to save, when you log out, what you have done is saved.

When you know you are all done click the box at the upper right that says print ready. That way the publisher knows you are done and it is ready to print. Have fun and lets all make the best yearbook ever. Larry Osburn      hlyakima@gmail.com
