

# Introducing New Advisors and New Classes!

**Miriam (Miri) Drori** was born in Bucharest, Romania. At twelve years old, she and her family moved to Israel. She grew up in Israel and became fluent in Hebrew. She attended Lewinsky College in Tel Aviv where she graduated with a teaching degree in ESL and Hebrew.

**Introduction to Hebrew Language & Culture, Tuesdays, 1-2 pm, cost: \$100/qt or \$40/mo (Feb-June)**

In this one semester course, through activities and classroom teaching, students will realize the richness and depth of the Hebrew language and culture. The text used will present all letters and vowels of the Hebrew alphabet with opportunities to practice complete words. In class exercises will teach visual discrimination of letters, auditory discrimination and manuscript writing. Students wishing to earn .5 credit will be assigned projects in Hebrew cultural studies. Class is for middle school-high school and *adults are also welcome!*

**Cheri Alexander** graduated from Washington State University with a degree in Nursing. She has practiced nursing for the past 25 years in Critical Care, Cardiac Care and Home Health Care. Presently Cheri works for Memorial Hospital (part time) as a Hospice Nurse. Cheri has 4 children and has been a home school mom for the past 17 years.

**High School Health, 12-1 pm, cost: \$100/qt or \$40/mo (Feb-June)**

This semester-long course will use the materials Total Health: Choices For a Winning Lifestyle, by Susan Boe, to teach aspects of health relating to the whole person: physical, emotional, social and spiritual. Students will learn through reading, guest speaker presentations, individual presentations, group presentations, and group discussions. They will be challenged to assess their own health and health risks, as well as make decisions for a healthy lifestyle in the future. If students and parents are interested, arrangements will be made for CPR training with each student becoming CPR certified. 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grades students may take this class and *adults are also welcome!*

**Wendi Frank** graduated from Central Washington University with a BA in Business Education and an MA in Master Teacher. She has taught in both private and public schools, most recently at Eisenhower High School from 1998-2011 in the Business Department. She has taught keyboarding, computer applications, business math, and accounting. She has homeschooled her daughter since 2003.

**Accounting, Tuesdays, 11am-12pm, cost: \$100/qt or \$40/mo (Feb-June), high school only**

Accounting is a one semester class where students will get an introduction to financial accounting concepts and a study of the accounting cycle of service organizations and merchandisers emphasizing the recording of business transactions and the preparation of financial statements for such organizations. Emphasis is also placed on the accounting principles relating to the measurement, valuation and reporting of current assets, long-term assets, current liabilities, payroll, equity, and related internal control considerations. Students will also learn concepts of accounting emphasizing the income statement and balance sheet and the accounting for cash, receivables, inventory, plant assets, intangible assets, current liabilities, and contingencies. This course will prepare students for various entry level jobs related to accounting as well as for furthering their studies at a two or four year college. Students may earn .5 credit in math or occupational ed. *Adults are also welcome!*

## *New Classes Offered by Current Advisors!*

### **Edgy Science, Tuesdays, 1-2pm, cost: \$100/qt or \$40/mo (Feb-June), high school**

Is it possible to clone an extinct species? Should we do so? What happens when you go through a black hole? What one substance may be the only ingredient for everything on earth? If you want to learn how to answer these questions, Edgy Science is for you—a new science class for today’s scientific discoveries. Taught by Shannan Golladay

### **Physics of Motion, Tuesdays, 10-11am, cost: \$100/qt or \$40/mo (Feb-June), middle school**

Using Capsela products provided in class, students, working in teams, will create a variety of machines in this one semester class. Students are challenged to think, explore, and problem solve. This class is a perennial HomeLink favorite! Taught by Larry Osburn.

### **Pet First Aid, Tuesdays, 12-1pm, cost: \$100/qt or \$40/mo (Feb-June), all ages**

This course will teach about pet health care, including emergencies for dogs, cats, and other companion animals. Students will learn how to examine their pet, recognize problems, and practice first aid for various conditions. This class also covers how to choose the right pet for your family, maintaining pet health, providing daily care, and traveling with a pet. High school students seeking credit will be assigned extra work by the instructor. Parents are welcome to attend with their children at no extra cost. Taught by Susanne Harfst

### **Elementary and Middle School Drama, Thursdays, 10-11:30am, cost: \$300/sem or \$60/mo (Feb-June)**

Students will perform a children’s classic, possibly “The Secret Garden,” “The Dancing Princess,” or a similar story. The choice of play will depend on the number of students who sign up, and the male:female ratio. It will be a play with a variety of roles, large and small. It will probably be a one act play, running about 1 hour. *Auditions will be Thursday, January 26, 10:30 am at HomeLink.*

### **High School Drama (by audition only), Thursdays, 12-1:30pm, cost: \$300/sem or \$60/mo (Feb-June)**

Students will perform Agatha Christi’s “And Then There Were None.” There are ten roles. Auditions for 7<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> graders are mandatory and will be from 12-1:30 on Thursday, January 26. Students who audition but don’t “fit” the characters in “And Then There Were None,” will automatically be considered for a part in the other drama.
